Doug Glanville Visits GSU—February 5

A "Conversation with Doug Glanville" will take place at 3:30 p.m. on Friday, February 5, in GSU's Engbretson Hall. The event is free and open to the public.

As an op-ed columnist for the New York Times, Glanville draws on his experience as a player for the Chicago Cubs and the Philadelphia Phillies to speak about the culture of sports and how a life in baseball represents the human condition, complete with triumph and setbacks, passion and disillusionment.

His widely popular column, Heading Home, led to his soon-to-be-published book, *The Game*

From Where I Stand. Further demonstrating Glanville's values and respect for the power and use of an education, he has put his University of Pennsylvania engineering degree to good use by founding GK Alliance, LLC, a green-friendly real estate development company specializing in residential building and franchising in Chicago western suburbs.

Glanville continues to promote his love of learning by helping others reach their potential through both his public speeches and the service organizations in which he is an active member. He serves on the board of Athletes Against Drugs, the fundraising committee of Chicago's Boundless Readers, and as a mentor to high school student-athletes and their parents in his Ask Doug column for Baseball Factory.

Glanville currently works as a baseball insider for XM Radio's MLB Home Plate - Power Alley and as a contributor with Comcast SportsNet Chicago.

Substitute Teacher Academy with Resources Workshop

GSU is hosting a one-day Substitute Teacher Academy with Resources workshop on February 20, from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. The workshop teaches new substitute teachers what to expect, what to do in an emergency, how to maintain classroom control and how to follow the teacher's lesson plans.

The State of Illinois offers substitute teacher certification to those with a bachelor's degree in any subject. Instruction on how to apply for the certificate is also included in the presentation. The academy provides ideas and activities subs can adapt and use in any school and any grade

While no special skills are required to get a substitute teacher certificate, many school districts encourage their subs, whether certified teachers or not, to take special substitute teacher workshops, such as this one, to familiarize themselves with the process and pitfalls of subbing.

Participants must hold a bachelor's degree and register by February 15. Registration is limited to 40 participants. The \$50 registration fee includes lunch and materials.

The Substitute Teacher Academy will be held in the Hall of Honors and is sponsored by the Metropolitan Institute of Leadership in Education (MILE) and the College of Education. For more information and to register, call 708.534.4024.
