
Hall Council Policy Quiz Update

Lock Out & Lost Key Policy

Lock Out Policy

You must carry your keys with you at all times. Being responsible with your key and myONECARD is important to your safety and that of your fellow residents. Keys and myONECARD are the responsibility of the resident. Residents may not lend their keys or myONECARD to anyone.

Lock Out Procedure

If you are locked out of your room or apartment, you will need to locate a housing staff member (Resident Assistant, Assistant Residence Hall Director, or Residence Hall Director) to open the door for you. Each residents is allowed (2) lock-out incidents per semester without charge. Beginning with the third lockout incident, you will be charge \$10 per incident to your student account.

Lost Key Policy

If you lose a key it should be reported immediately to the Residence Hall Director. You will receive a temporary key until your room/apartment door can be re-cored and a new key issued to you. You will be responsible for the cost of the re-core and new key. If the temporary key is not returned in the allotted time, a charge of \$25 will be assessed to your Student Account.

Side Door Policy



Per the University Housing Policy accessing known or marked restricted areas is prohibited.

As a reminder, the side door near the gated parking lot is considered a restricted area from IOPM to 8AM.

During this time you must enter the building through the main entrance.

If students are seen accessing the building during the prohibited hours listed above, they will be referred to conduct.

Health and Safety Inspections for Fall 2017

The Prairie Place Housing Staff will be conducting health and safety inspections throughout the FALL semester and the first inspection will take place on *Tuesday*, *September 26th from 8PM-9:30PM*.

During these inspections any violation of the <u>University Housing Handbook 2017-2018</u> will be documented and any appliances that are against University policy will be confiscated. <u>Residents do not have to be present in the room during the inspections.</u>

Prairie Place staff will do the following to administer inspections:

- Staff will knock on the door and announce themselves
- After 2-3 knocks if the student does not respond the staff member will key into the room
- 3) Once in the room staff will do a visual inspection for any health & safety policy violations. Please note, that if any other violations are identified as a result of the health and safety inspection they will also be documented and any illegal items in the room will be confiscated.
- 4) Staff will assess the overall cleanliness of the room during

the health & safety inspection. Rooms/apartments that are significantly filthy will be documented as well. If a unit fails due to cleanliness, the residents of that unit will have I week to rectify any noted cleanliness issues. If upon a second inspection it is still an issue, residents of that unit will be referred through the conduct process

On exiting the room/ apartment staff will secure all doors

We encourage students to take time to review the <u>University</u> Housing Handbook 2017-2018.

Tips For Passing Health and Safety Inspections

Prior to the first Health and Safety Inspection scheduled for *Tuesday*, *September 26th from 8PM-9:30PM*, residents should arrange a time with their roommates to ensure the room/apartment is cleaned (e.g. clean the dishes, take out the trash, etc.).


Also, just a reminder the following appliances are **NOT** permitted in Prairie Place:

- Devices with open heating elements
- 2) Toaster ovens

- 3) Freezers
- 4) Lava lamps
- Halogen light bulbs (used in desk lamps or free standing lamps)
- Window/portable air conditioners
- All indoor grills (e.g. Black and Decker®, George Foreman® etc.)
- 8) Candles, incense, lanterns or any similar open flame devices


