Seeking applications supporting both large and exploratory basic research studies into the biological/genetic causes and mechanisms of cancer health disparities. Funds support pilot and feasibility studies designed to investigate biological/genetic bases of cancer disparities, such as: mechanistic studies of biological factors associated with cancer disparities; the development and testing of new methodologies and models; and secondary data analyses.
