University Library Computer System

The University Library has recently installed four terminals which can be used by patrons to search for materials in the GSU collection. They can be used as an alternative to the author/title card catalog as well as being used to search the databases of 18 other Illinois schools. The terminals were donated to the library by the Alumni Association.

When the library move has been com-

pleted, two of the terminals will be situated in the card catalog area, one in the Serials area, and one at the Reference desk. The terminals are connected and useable. There are directions for use provided on each terminal and the librarians will be pleased to assist anyone who needs help.

Funds for the terminals were raised last year as a result of the Alumni Telethon.

A new book on social work practice with minorities by Dr. David R. Burgest, university professor of social work at GSU, has been published by Scarecrow Press, Inc.

Burgest researched the material for two years. He provides a conceptual framework for students, educators and practitioners of the social work profession and related fields. The 322-page book contains 29 readings by a range of authors representative of many ethnic and racial groups, providing different perspectives and points of view.
