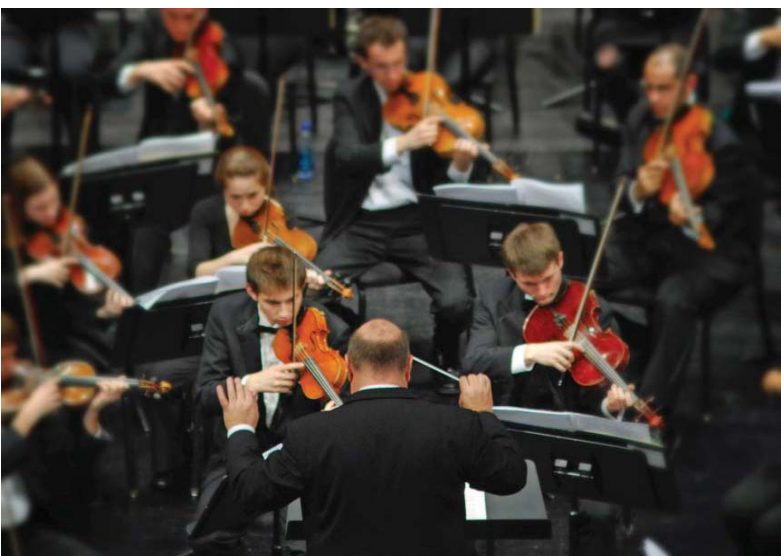

Musicians from The Chicago College of Performing Arts' orchestra in the CPA Green Room warming up for their evening performance at the Center Monday



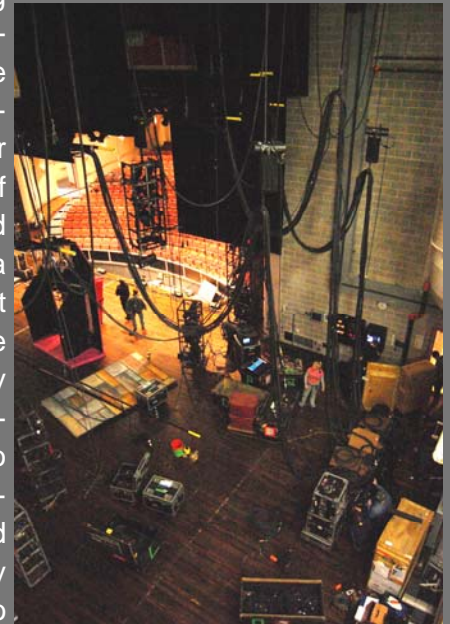
Last Monday, The Chicago College of Performing Arts' Orchestra presented another of their complimentary concerts here at the CPA. The performance included works by Ravel, Respighi, Sarasate, and Bartok. Solo competition winners on harp, violin, and voice were featured.

The Chicago Musical College was founded in 1867, less than four decades after the city of Chicago was incorporated. It has given over a hundred years of uninterrupted service to music and music education and has played an important role in the development of the cultural life of the Midwest.

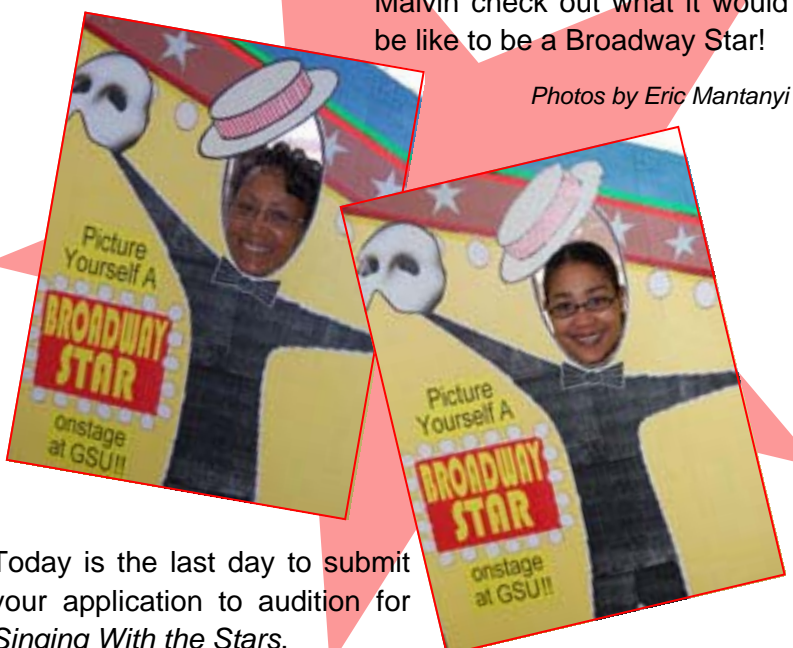
