HOLIDAY PLANT OPTION -- Dr. Virginio L. Piucci, vice president for administration and planning, has announced that a special service will be available over "The holthe holiday vacation period. iday closing of the university is often very hard on your office plants because most lights remain off during this time," Dr. Piucci said. "This year tables will be set up in E Lounge for the plants to utilize available natural light," he added. Persons desiring to take advantage of the service must (1) put their names on their plants; (2) water the plants well; (3) take all plants to E Lounge between 2 and 4 p.m. on Dec. 21; and (4) pick plants up promptly on Jan. 3. "The temperature in E Lounge will be low, so additional water should not be required if the plant is watered well," Dr. Piucci "No additional security will be said. provided, so prompt pick-up on Jan. 3 is recommended," he added.

Parking service attendants will provide battery quick starts and serve as escorts to university parking lots Monday through Thursday from 4-11 p.m. The attendants are located next to the information booth at the main entrance.

**NEW SAFETY POLICY** -- As of Wednesday, Dec. 19, the university will restrict vehicle traffic on paved walks around the building. Walkways that will be chained closed are those on the north side of the main building and the walkway leading to the YMCA entrance. According to Michael Foley, director of physical plant, the decision to close the walkways to vehicles has been made as a safety move. Foley said the walkways are intended for pedestrians and not automobiles.
