
HIS STATISTICS ARE BIG -- If you have ever wondered about the reasons for or source of the thousands of bits of statistical information generated about Governors State University every year, ask Alan Bennett of the Administration and Planning Unit.

Alan, a six-year "veteran of innovation," is coordinator for institutional research. In a typical year he is involved with some 70 reports dealing with student demographics and financial matters. Most are required by one or more of the governmental agencies responsible for the operation of Governors State. Others are special studies to keep the GSU family up to date on developments and trends at GSU as well as in the higher education field.

Alan takes seriously the commuter nature of the university. He commutes daily from Elmwood Park, a northern suburb. That's a daily round trip of about 100 miles, or 25,000 miles a year; or 150,000 miles since he joined the AP staff in 1979. Being statistically minded, he could probably also tell you how many gallons of gas his car consumes, the average miles per gallon, and the mean average of the price of gas per gallon, plus or minus two percent during that time. Just ask him!

Alan resides in Elmwood Park where he grew up. He has been active in local affairs and currently serves as an Elmwood Park village trustee. He has been a member of the Elmwood Park Community Unit District 401 school board from 1971 to 1974 and is a former chair of the village planning commission.

Prior to joining Governors State, he was assistant director of institutional studies and planning at Northeastern Illinois University for ten years. He earned the B.S. in Business Administration at Elmhurst College and

the M.A. in Political Science at Northern Illinois University.

Alan is definitely a BMOC (big man on campus). At 6 feet 5 1/2 inches, he is one of the tallest people here. While he hesitates to tell you how much he weighs, he looks like he could hold down a position on the Chicago Bears' defensive line. He keeps in shape by swimming a half-mile every noon in the YMCA pool.

Alan and his wife, Janet, have three children: Diane 16, Jeffrey 13, and Colleen 11.

Keyfax is a system for sending graphics, words, and numbers through a telephone network. The special terminal is sold at several stores including Marshall Field's and is a feature of some personal computers.
