AT THE BOG...At its February meeting, the Board of Governors authorized a tuition increase amounting to approximately \$75 for in-state students and \$222 for out-of-state students for the regular (Sept.-June) academic year effective this fall. The action merely reaffirms the Board's approval which was granted at its January, 1971 meeting but deferred for lack of legislative authorization to allocate the monies collected as additions to institutional income funds...there will not be a March meeting of the BOG...the next scheduled meeting is April 12-13 at GSU.
