UNIVERSITY ASSEMBLY...At its meeting Thursday, March 30, the Assembly rejected a motion to ease the process for amending the University Constitution...Also defeated was a motion to reduce the number required for an Assembly quorum from the present 50% to one-third of the 33 members.... On recommendation from the standing Committee on Educational Programs and Policies, the Assembly passed a motion asking student assemblymen who desire credit for participation in the governance process to use the vehicle of independent study to design a module with appropriate performance objectives...

Also passed was a motion accepting a temporary diploma cover design with a permanent design to be chosen when more students are involved in choosing from the various alternatives to be presented...The Assembly sent on to the President a resolution that a University convocation be held between the fifth and sixth session this year (in June or July) and that this first convocation include the inauguration of the President...

The matter of late registration fees was briefly discussed. The fees which have not been applied previously will be applied on a regular basis beginning next session. A clarifying statement will appear in the next issue of the student newspaper.
