### Fiscal Year 2008 Year End Deadlines

It is that time of year again. No, not tax time. That date has already been and gone.

The Departments of Financial Services and Procurement would like to remind everyone to submit appropriate paperwork to their offices before the following deadlines:

- Invoices and travel reimbursements must be submitted by June 30.
- Requisitions and purchase orders must be submitted by June 2 for services completed by June 30 and products received by July 15.
- Office supplies must be ordered by June 13.
- Grants must follow the above dates for application to FY '08 budgets.

And because you don't have enough work, you may also submit for processing FY '09 contracts, purchases, and blankets for a July 1 start date.
