PHASE II CAPITOL BUDGET APPROVED BY BOG...At its September meeting the BOG approved GSU's request of a \$21,694,264 Fiscal Year 74 capitol budget, the bulk of which goes toward the construction of an additional 400,000 square feet beyond the 400,000 square feet now under construction in Phase I. The request has yet to hurdle the Board of Higher Education, the Legislature, and the Governor....also approved was a \$6.9 million internal operating budget for the current fiscal year...planning money for Phase II has already passed the Legislature, though not yet released by the Governor...when the money is released, the GSU machinery for developing the University beyond Phase I will predictably involve the creative energy of the entire University...

Also at the BOG, the President reviewed GSU's admissions policies including a deliberate program of recruitment of minority students. Admissions are handled by college and programs on a first come first served basis...the BOG affirmed the current policy and also approved GSU's request that veterans qualified under the current GI Bill be granted priority status in admissions over non-veterans while retaining minority applicant priorities...the BOG also approved the request to expand the experimental program of the student assistant deans as an annual staff assignment (Sam DeBose is SAD in CEAS, Rebecca Keller in CCS, and June Anderson in CBPS, with CHLD still selecting)...also approved was the appointment of Bill Katz as Dean of CHLD (a search committee for CHLD Dean is now being established for the purpose of selecting a successor for next year)

BPS POLITICAL CAMPAIGN SERIES...It's McGovern's turn in the BPS lecture series this evening at 7:00 p.m. in the Commons. Representative John Houlihan, a candidate for Congress in the 17th Congressional District, will represent the McGovern for President campaign. Future speakers for the Monday evening series include Congressional Candidate Robert Hanrahan, Gubernatorial candidate Dan Walker, Governor Richard Ogilvie, and Senator Charles Percy. All are seeking employment in government.

STAFF ID CARDS...Both new and returning staff should obtain new ID cards in the Student Services area.

Noted Psychiatrist, Dr. Bernard Schulman, will be the first speaker in the series which has as its theme "Ways of Facilitating Human Potential". Dr. Schulman will have an informal seminar with faculty from noon until 2:00 p.m., another informal seminar with students from 3:00 p.m. until 5:00 and make a formal presentation in the Commons at 7:30 p.m. on procedures for establishing a therapeutic community. It may or may not be funny, but it certainly will be human.

IN THE WORKS...a new staff directory is now being compiled by the Office of Communications and should be available within the next two weeks...a slide/tape introduction to GSU intended for prospective students will be produced in the next month for use by the Junior College Relations Office by the Office of Communications working with the ICC.
