THE UNIVERSITY ASSEMBLY...at a special meeting held January 4, considered the Professional Personnel Systems document submitted for approval by the Standing Committee on Human Services. DON DOUGLAS presented a total of four amendments to the original document. The first concerned the endorsement of the AAUP position, policies, and procedures on academic freedom and tenure and professional ethics instead of the AASCU statement on academic freedom and responsibility and academic tenure. The roll call vote, after a lengthy discussion, produced a tie which was broken by the chair and the amendment was passed. Douglas' second amendment dealing with a word change within the document, was also passed. A third amendment was withdrawn in order to perfect the language of the amendment and a fourth failed for lack of a second. The Professional Personnel Systems document, as amended, was passed.

The next regular meeting of the University Assembly will be Thursday, February 1 at 4:00 p.m. in room 308. At that time, the newly elected Assembly will have its first organizational meeting. On January 15, ballots for the election will be mailed and/or distributed to students, faculty, and staff. Ballot boxes will be in the Learning Resources Center on January 23 and 24 from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. The election results will be announced on January 25. January 30 and 31 will be the time for the election of officers to the new University Assembly.

CLEP TESTS TO BE ADMINISTERED...by R & I. The College-Level Examination Programs General Examinations will be available to GSU students who are enrolling for the first time during the J-F Session. R & I has received permission to administer these tests on campus and to waive all student fees normally associated with the tests. The results of these tests will be used primarily to establish base-line data that will be useful in developing a policy for alternative means of awarding credit. In this regard, it will be helpful to develop base-line data for potential students as well as those already enrolled. Therefore an opportunity is being provided for GSU personnel (Civil Service and other) who might be considered potential GSU students, to participate. The tests will be administered at GSU from 1-4 on Fri. Jan. 26 and Sat. Jan. 27, and from 8:30-11:30 on Sat. Jan. 27. If interested, contact R & I for further information.
