Speech-Language Students Receive Assessment Equipment...With the generous gift of a national sorority, GSU's speech-language pathology program has purchased state-of-the-art testing equipment to help students assess speech and language problems in young children.

The \$250 gift was given by the Lansing Eta Upsilon Chapter which is affiliated with Psi Iota Xi. This is the second gift the sorority has given to the university. **Professor Mary Jones**, an instructor in children's language disorders and diagnostic methods in communication disorders, said the purchase of Sequenced Inventory of Communication Development was necessary for the program to instruct students in the problems of very young children, infants to age two.
