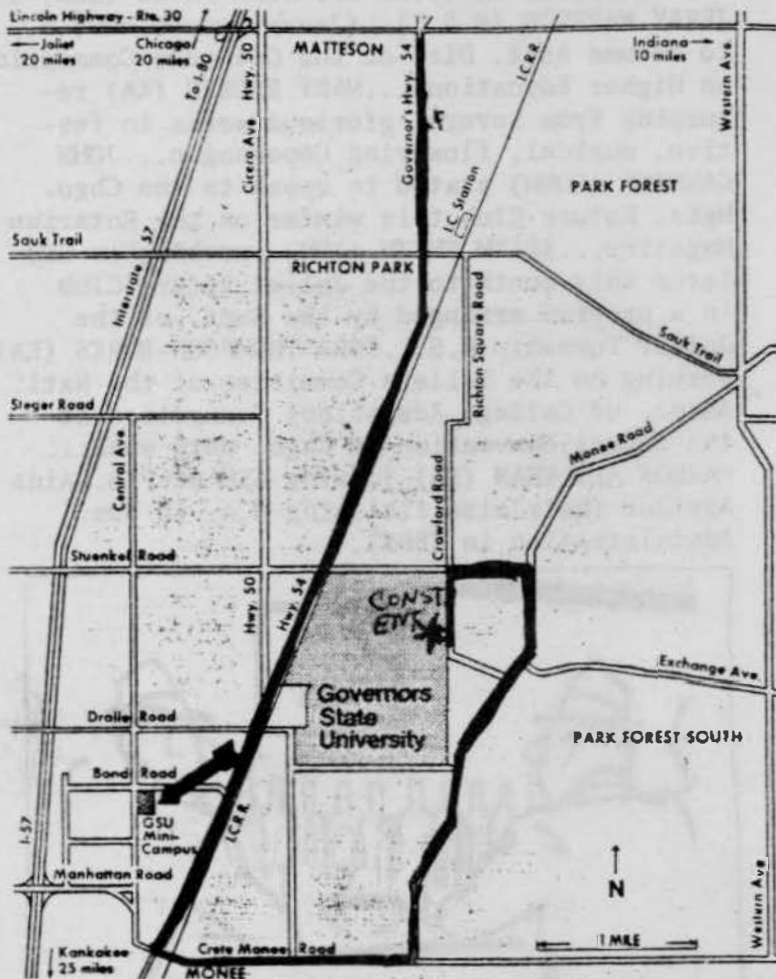

STUENKEL ROAD CLOSED FOR TWO WEEKS...beginning Monday, October 1, for a complete face lift between Governors Highway and Crawford Avenue. If you're wondering how to get to the Planning Building or Hantack House, here are some alternate routes and a map:



From the west (or Governors Highway):

Take Governors Highway south of the campus to Crete Monee Road;
Then east on Crete Monee Road to Monee Road;
Then North (or left) on Monee Road (you're doubling back now) to Stuenkel;
Turn left on Stuenkel and go west past the Park Forest Golf Course (the first on the right) to Crawford (the first intersection)
Turn left on Crawford and proceed to the CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCE where signs will guide you the rest of the way.

From the east (or Park Forest or Park Forest South):

Take Monee Road to Stuenkel Road;
West on Stuenkel Road to Crawford Avenue (the first intersection);
Then left (or south) on Crawford to the CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCE where signs will point the way from there.

TEACHING AT GSU: IS IT DIFFERENT?...An important reminder for an important discussion. OPTIONAL GRADES AT GSU?...One controversial recommendation of an Ad Hoc Subcommittee on Reporting Student Competencies received by SCEPP is for adoption of an optional grading system (in addition to competency statements). Before taking action on this and other subcommittee recommendations, SCEPP will hold open hearings to clarify the intent of the proposal and to solicit comments from the general University Community. The recommendations are posted on the Communications bulletin board at the North end of the Commons and a copy may be obtained (while they last) from Assembly secretary PAM MADSEN (ext. 211). She is the only black woman in the Ill. Assembly & has legislative interests involving public welfare, public aid, human resources, corrections, labor unions, health, and urban matters.

NEEDED--AN INTERESTED, INFORMED CIVIL SERVANT ...The resignation of CLIFF KOEHLER from GSU has left a vacancy on the Civil Service MERIT BOARD ADVISORY COMMITTEE for a Civil Service Representative from GSU. The MERIT BOARD is the employment policy-making body for all state universities in Illinois. It serves to improve and update the system, rules and procedures under which some 22,000 university civil service employees work throughout the state. It deals with policies concerning job reclassifications, testing, pay scales and other matters at all state universities.

As one of the 20 member ADVISORY COMMITTEE, the GSU rep. will be required to attend each of the four regularly scheduled meetings per year. The meetings, and occasional special meetings, are usually held in the Springfield area, equidistant to all universities in the state. A University car and travel allowance is provided, and time off with pay is required by law.

Interested persons should obtain a petition from the Personnel office at GSU Planning Bldg. Upon obtaining the 25 signatures required, your name will be placed on the ballot for the upcoming election to fill this vacancy.
