CLASSES RESCHEDULED FOR JAN/FEB SESSION... Looking for your class? It's the old not the new as all instruction begins in the mini-campus for the J/F Session. Building delays have prevented all class space at the permanent campus from being completed in time. Scheduling revisions and hours of various support units (most of which will be located at the new campus) are included on the reverse side of this sheet. Some support units, including the LRC and A & R will be offering limited services at the mini-campus. Students are being informed by direct mail and via the media. The revised schedule will be posted on bulletin boards in the entryways of the mini-campus and at the main entrance of the new campus. As class space is completed in the new campus, learning modules will be shifted to the original schedule after a week to ten days notice to the coordinator that the space is available.

INFO AND TRAVEL... An information center will be staffed by Student Services in the main entrance area of the main campus to assist students and visitors to destinations in the new building as well as decoding where classes are being held. In addition, a bus operated by B & PO will facilitate movement between the two campuses. (see the schedule in this issue of FASE I)

REMEMBER TO SHIFT YOUR CLOCK AN HOUR AND A HALF SUNDAY... The unusual shift occurs for GSUers adjusting to daylight savings time by moving the clocks ahead one hour and the new GSU official hours of 8-5 beginning January 7. Those who came to work at 8:30 a.m. CST will be coming to work at 7:00 a.m. CST which will be 8:00 a.m. CDT. (Just come at 8 a.m., daylight savings time.)

WATCH THOSE CONSTRUCTION AREAS... The University community and the general public are asked to stay clear of the construction areas of the new campus (generally the eastern portion of the campus). Upon entering the new building, individuals should proceed either to the left or upstairs. Portions of the main entrance area itself and the buildings to the right (CCS and CEAS) will be identified as construction areas to be avoided both for safety purposes and to facilitate completion of the new campus.

NEW PHONE NUMBER FOR GSU... is 534-5000 (which should be typed in place of the old number on stationery and other forms where appropriate for the unit).

COMMENCEMENT CHANGE...The January 20 Commencement will not be accompanied by sand blasting in the Hall of Governors in the main entrance area of the new building. A more musical accompaniment will be enjoyed in the old LRC area of the mini-campus. The location of Commencement was changed to the mini-campus when it became apparent that it was doubtful the Hall of Governors would be completed on time. The Jan. 20 Commencement will not have the traditional speaker, opting instead for a multi-media presentation featuring slides, film, and audio tape and three screens. The 12-minute media presentation fittingly traces the commencement of GSU in the paint store days to the new campus facilities. RALPH KRUSE (ICC) and JERRY REICH (ICC) get the production credits with music by WARRICK CARTER (CCS) and initial concept by MARY LOU CAMPBELL (COMM).

FUND DEADLINE EXTENDED...The deadline for submission of five-page preliminary proposals to Fund for Improvement of Secondary Education has been extended to Jan. 15. Guidelines are still available in R & I if you are interested in submitting a project. Remember, GSU/R & I deadline is one week before the sponsor's deadline.

1974 GSU BULLETIN...is now available in limited quantities from A & R. The full supply of Bulletins will be delivered after A & R moves to its new home about January 11. Comments and corrections should be directed to Bulletin editor MARY LOU CAMPBELL (COMM).

WELCOME TO THE "COMPUTING CENTER"...following the recommendations of the Prosser Report which concerned itself with computer functions and MIS, the name MIS (Management Information Systems) has been changed to the "Computing Center." (CC?)

STUDENT BECOMES BOG MEMBER...FELICITAS BERLANGA whose appointment by GOV. WALKER was initially denied by the Illinois Senate Executive Committee, was finally approved by the Illinois Senate and will join the BOG for its January meeting hosted by GSU at the Crete Holiday Inn on Wednesday and Thursday. Ms. Berlanga is a 21-year old student at Illinois State University at Normal, Illinois.

FOOD SERVICE...There will be an attempt to have limited food services available at the permanent campus starting on January 7. The legal date for the start of food services is January 14. It might be wise to come prepared for "eating in."

GSU HARDHATS...working to complete Phase I a many construction workers and many contractors. Contact between GSU construction workers and the rest of the University community is likely to be more frequent. Remember that the construction workers are responsible to their foremen and are not available to assist staff directly. They are there to do the job of completing our University. You can assist them by being cordial, letting them do their job, and generally staying clear of places marked "Construction Area."

WHERE'D THE MAILROOM GO?...To the Planning Building, that's where. Regular pick-up and delivery of mail to the moving campus is now being placed in operation.

HOW ABOUT CENTRAL DUPLICATING? The FAZE I Phase I map a few weeks ago omitted central duplicating which is located in Building D on the first floor across from the Personnel Office.

HAVE A BALL...at the second annual Black and White Ball set for Saturday, January 19 at 9:00 p.m. at the Hickock Lodge in Park Forest South. Guests are encouraged to wear black and/or white and/or grey for this "fancy" affair. For more info and reservations, check with the University Advocate's Office.

PARKING AT PHASE I...Student and staff parking will be available in lots B, C, and D (the three westerly lots) south of Phase I. Lot A (most easterly) is reserved for construction parking. No parking is permitted on drives or walkways near the building except by permit from the contractor or the University for critical construction or moving. Only University visitors and guests are to utilize the "Visitor" parking area south of the main entrance circle. Because of the snow, the lots have not been lined. The University community is asked to cooperate by using a "parallel" system of parking. Careless parking could mean a shortage of space during peak hours. Please ask the Security Patrol in the lots to assist and direct you as problems arise.

BOOKSTORE HOURS:...at the permanent campus are 8:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. Monday-Friday and 8:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. Saturday. The Bookstore is located on the first floor to the right of the main entrance. Signs will point the way off the Commons area just east of the Food Service area. Later in the session, these hours will be reduced. FAZE I will keep you posted.
