S/O REGISTRATION...at last report late Tues. stood at 2,750. Students continued late registration throughout the week. A summary of the official ten day enrollment report will be printed in FAZE 1 when received. Students may continue to register and add/drop until Sept. 10 after which classes may be dropped only.

PART-TIMERS AIDED...Governor Walker signed into law legislation that would provide additional scholarship aid to college students, including a new program of financial help for part-time students in public and private universities. According to the Governor, Illinois will be the first major industrial state to give scholarship aid to part-time students. The legislation sponsored by Rep. Eugenia Chapman (D-Arlington Heights) also extends scholarship eligibility to students enrolled in a fifth year of undergraduate study. At last report, GSU's Financial Aids Office had not yet been officially notified of the new provisions by the Illinois State Scholarship Commission.
