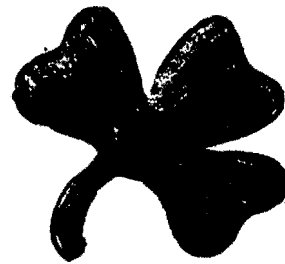

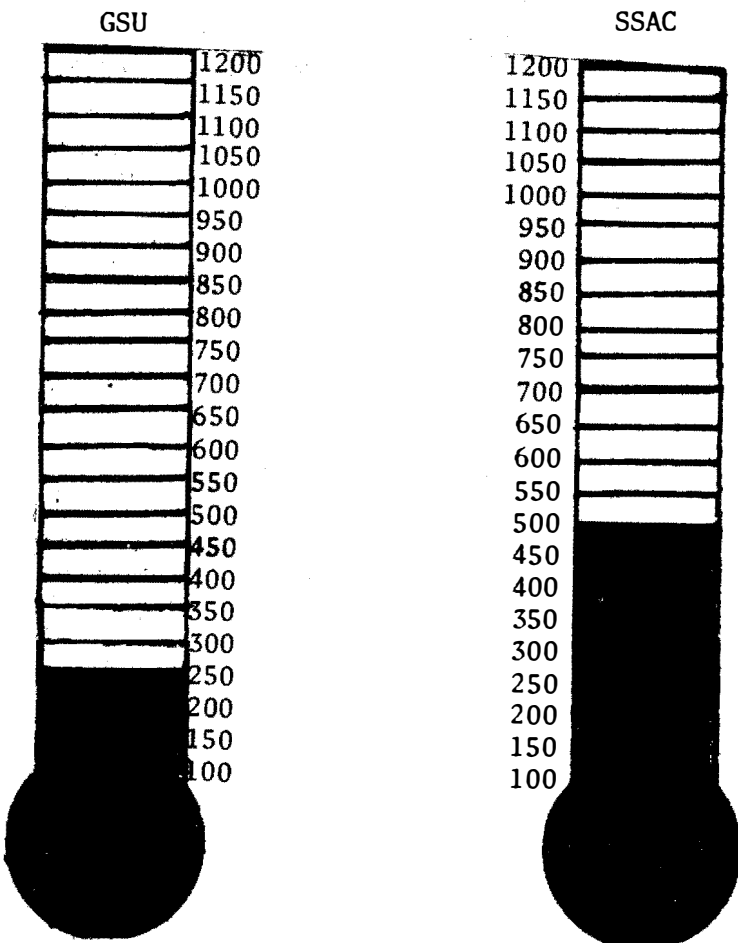

Register heated activity as preparations and deadlines advance. Our contributions thermometer seems to have hit a temporary freeze, however. It's hoped a quick thaw can be reported next week...

Living descendants of past governors of Illinois are being sought in order to extend to them invitations to the GSU Dedication. Historiographer Mrs. Philip Dalby, wife of the former president of Thornton Community College, is researching family trees of Illinois governors at the Chicago Historical Society and in Springfield...

EAS activities for Dedication include a Laboratory Open House with guided tours and demonstrations; a First Friday Series featuring distinguished lecturers speaking on science-related subjects to the non-academic public; Mobile Laboratory Tours; films and displays on Alcoholism, in addition to the many activities planned by other units previously announced. VA LOANS AVAILABLE...Veterans attending college under the GI Bill experiencing economic difficulties are eligible to apply for a loan up to \$600 in one academic year from the Veterans Administration. JOHN HEINZ, GSU VA Vet Rep, said the loans are the result of new legislation enacted in December. The effective date for the loan program was January 1, but all eligible veterans, wives and survivors will be considered for initial loans based upon the full amount of their tuition and all other costs of attendance anticipated for the entire 1974-75 academic year. Repayments schedules do not begin until after the student completes schooling, and the 8% interest does not accrue until the required beginning date of repayment. The student applicant must have exhausted all efforts to obtain student loans administered by the Department of HEW. For more info, call JOHN at ext. 2126.

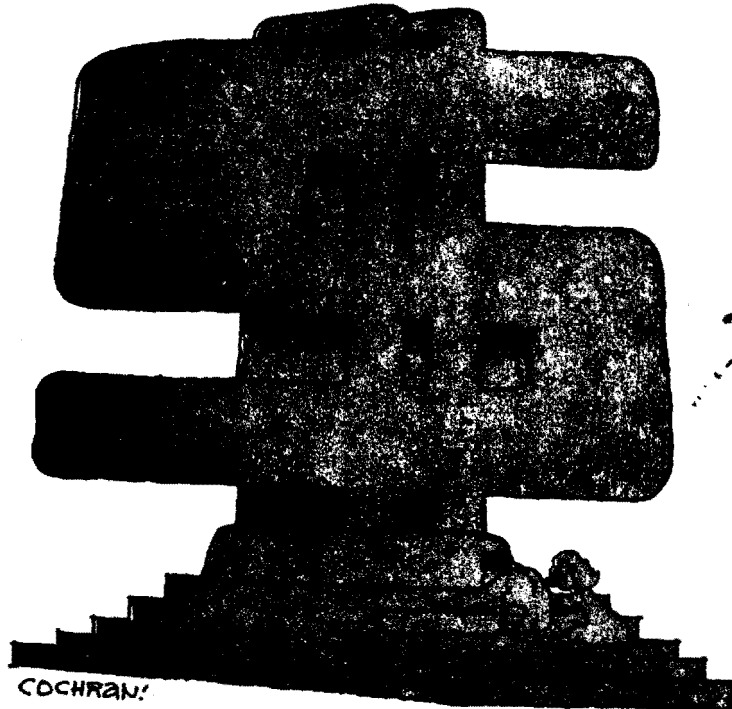
Dedication provides a unique opportunity and audience for this publication, so please submit and ensure the success of this project. All submissions should be made to the Innovator by March 18.
