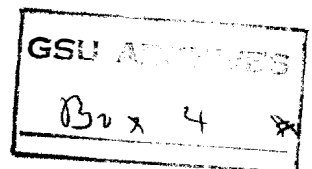

**FATTER PAYCHECKS...**The Tax Reduction Act of 1975 requires a reduction of federal income tax withheld from employee's wages during the 1975 tax year. The new tax tables cover the last eight months of 1975 and are pro-rated to adjust for over-withholding during the first four months of 1975. Thus, all employees will see a small increase in the net amount of their check beginning May 16, 1975.
