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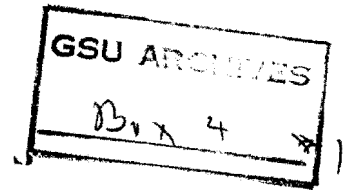

**NEW UNIVERSITY CONSTITUTION...**The GSU Community will have the opportunity to vote on a new university constitution during the week of June 23-27. The document must receive the approval of a majority of those voting in the student, faculty, civil service, and administrative constituencies to be considered ratified. Informational hearings on the proposed constitution will be held Tuesday, June 10, from 6 to 8 p.m. and on June 12 from 3 to 5 p.m. in B1108. Copies of the document are available at the reserve desk of the LRC, in the Student Services Office, University Advocate's Office, with all unit heads and Student Assistant Deans. The most significant portions of the text will be published in the INNOVATOR.

Prior to the hearings, questions about the proposed new governance system may be directed to members of the Governance Committee, including LOWELL CULVER (BPS), Chairman, and MARVIN BROTTMAN (HLD), JAMES BUCKENMYER (BPS), ROBERTA BALKE (LRC), ROY COGDELL (HLD), MICHAEL FOLEY (BPO), RICHARD GAUFIN (EAS), ANNA GIEREK (BO), FRANCIS WASHINGTON (BPS), and ELMER WITT (CM/CS).

**GRANTS AVAILABLE: EXXON EDUCATION FOUNDATION...** has announced a new funding program called IMPACT (Implementation of Materials and Procedures Affecting College Teaching). Under IMPACT, the Foundation will disseminate information about educational innovations of demonstrated merit and, as funds allow, share the cost of implementation with institutions wishing to adopt one. Grants are available in these areas: "Guided Design" - a new teaching method combining principles of programmed instruction with open-ended problem-solving; "Exper Sim" - a system for teaching research design through computer simulation;

"Tips" - a diagnostic tool to individualize instruction in the large class;  
"Student-to-Student Counseling" - a systematic approach to training students as academic counselors. For more info, call BILL DODD, ext. 2122.

The rap group was organized as part of a class in "Alternative Learning Environments" by Ms. Burkhardt in 1973.

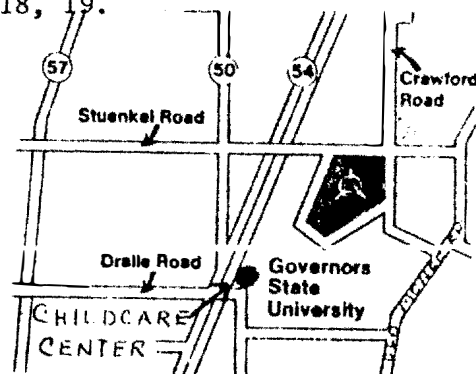

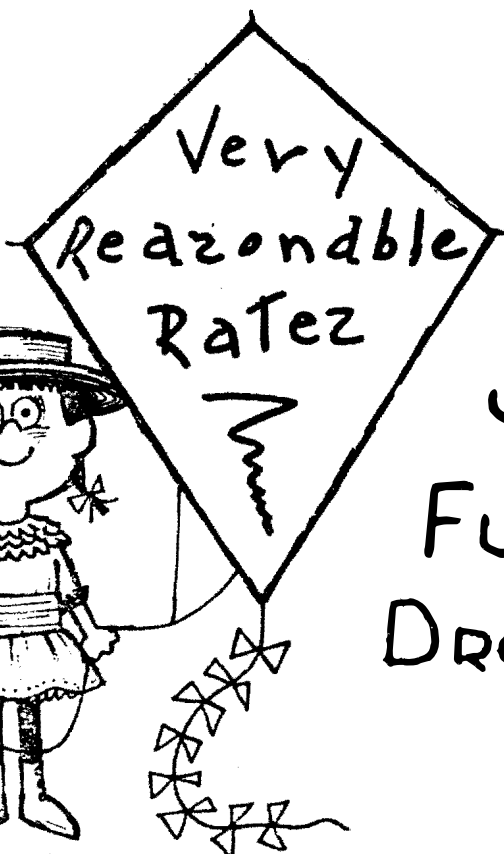
