University Park, Illinois, March 17, 2006 – Governors State University's College of Business and Public Administration (CBPA) will hold a Master of Public Administration Graduate Degree Program information session on Tuesday, March 28, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., at the James R.
