Anthropology and Sociology, B.A. for change in annual listing from concentrations to a complete cross-disciplinary degree: Even though this was a proposal for change in annual listing, APRC requested additional documentation for a more complete representation of the program and for easier access to all materials needed for accreditation reports due this spring. The program was approved with the following feedback:

- APRC appreciates the additional documentation (APRC request 2-24-20, Curriculum Map, External Review). APRC recognizes the improvement of changing the annual listing from the separate Sociology and Anthropology concentrations to the combined Anthropology & Sociology (ANSO) program. In preparation for the cyclical review, demonstrate how the program has addressed the 16 recommendations made by the external reviewer, chart enrollment for the combined major, and demonstrate the increased visibility and marketability of the program.

Analytical Chemistry, M.A. cyclical review: Four task members, led by Joong-Won Shin who is in the division, read, annotated, and reported to the committee. The other four members are tasked with reading the documents to provide feedback at the next meeting.
