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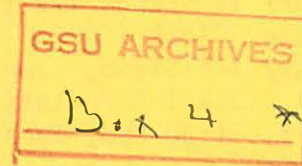

**ANTIQUARIAN SOCIETY SETS MARCH DEADLINE FOR FELLOWSHIP APPLICATIONS.** The American Antiquarian Society has set a deadline of *March 1, 1976* for applications for Visiting Fellowships during the year June 1, 1976 - May 31, 1977. Eligible are persons engaged in scholarly research and writing, including those at work on doctoral dissertations. Fellowships will be awarded not only on the basis of the applicant's scholarly qualifications and the general interest of the project, but also on the appropriateness of the inquiry to the Society's holdings. Recipients will be expected to be in regular residence at the Society's library during the period of the grant. Fellowships vary in duration from one to three months, while stipends may vary in amount, according to a Fellow's needs, to a maximum of \$2,500.
