UNIVERSITY PRESIDENTIAL SEARCH COMMITTEE ELECTIONS

GET YOUR NOMINATING PETITIONS TODAY!!!!

Members of the GSU community who are interested in the work of the committee should begin working to nominate and muster support for those candidates they feel would best represent their interests.

Civil Service, support and student constituencies will elect their representatives to the Presidential Search Committee, supervised and conducted by the GSU Election Commission. One support person (non-civil service status), elected by support personnel, two full-time Civil Service employees will be elected at large by all full-time employees with civil service status; four full-time students, in good standing will be elected, one from each college, by the student body of each college.

Nominating petitions for all persons interested in being elected to the selection committee are available as of this date from Regina Williams, secretary to the University Assembly, or from the Information Office. Ms. Williams' office is presently located on the third floor, in the President's area.

A petition requires 5% or 10 signatures, whichever number is fewer, from the constituencies to be represented on the committee. Information as to the necessary signatures required for each constituency is on the petition.

DEADLINE: All petitions must be turned in to Regina Williams by 12:00 Noon, Friday, January 9, 1976.

The elections will be held on January 12, 13, and 14. The results will be announced immediately and the first meeting of the committee will be on January 16, 1976.
