 - 2020 Real College survey results
 - Hope serves 500,00 students at 600 institutions
 - 2.2% response rate, redone in fall 2020 with a 13.7% response rate
 - Major findings 3 out 5 basic needs insecurity (+ other stats) at GSU include food, housing, homelessness
