- I. Call to Order and Approval of Agenda: The meeting was called to order with a quorum at 1:04 p.m. by Faculty Senate President Cummings. Agenda approval moved and seconded by Executive Committee. Agenda approved without amendment.
- II. Approval of Officer Appointment: Approval of C. Didion to serve as Parliamentarian
- III. Presentations: No presentations
- IV. External Reports
  - A. University Administration (Green, Sexton, and Bradford)

- President Green welcomed those in attendance to a new year and new semester
- Administration completed the addendum with UPI for the return to campus. President Green addressed an email that implied administration refused to bargain. She said the communication contained misinformation/misunderstanding as administration has completed four MOUs with UPI.
- President Green thanked Senate President Cummings for work done to prepare for the ISHE commission for affordable academic finding.
- President Green spoke about Dr. Damon William's presentation held earlier in the morning and invited faculty to join the faculty session held at 3:30.
- President Green announced GSU is planning regular face to face graduation with outdoor celebrations
- Dr. Sexton shared that there is a glitch with the Blackboard following the transition to the self hosted server to cloud server. The Blackboard app needs to be refreshed by being redownloaded
- Dr. Sexton gave a call out to senate committees: UCC chaired by Catherine Tymkow for work in the fall. (Lisa helm is now working in Provost Office.) Amy Vujaklija chair of APRC has completed early program reviews in fall, and working on programs coming up February 1<sup>st</sup>. (Marco K left GSU in December. Jessica Haynes is the analyst working on reports contact her or Erin Glimb and cc Dr. Sexton.) Chris White, IPC and APC working with general counsel. AMPAC reconstituting, met in fall Lei Wei co-chair,
- Dr. Sexton spoke about the decline in student enrollment at the community college that will impact GSU. Total FTE, down 8.5%, total student credit hours are down 9%, undergraduate FTE down 14%, graduate credit hours up 2.98%
- Amy Comparon (co-chair) will restart the retention graduation subcommittee
- Dr. Sexton gave kudos to Paul Mc Guinness as new student enrollment is up
- President Green shared that GSU is implementing the strategic enrollment plan, co-chaired by Dr. Johnsen and Paul McGuiness. The State of Illinois implemented the common application. Surrounding states have lower tuition rates and a declining birth rate.
- New Provost will being March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Dr. Bradford thanked senate members for their participation in the development of the campus facility master plan. The plan was given to board January 5<sup>th</sup> to be finalized by end of spring semester. The plan sets a new road map for the university to be implemented over the next 10 years. Includes spaces for collaborative spaces, new clinical spaces,

a new library, new student study spaces, and faculty offices. For a copy of draft contact John Potempa.

- Dr. Bradford spoke at the all-college meetings where he encouraged submission of innovative funding proposals. Currently in the budgeting planning stage. Submit ideas to advance growth and close achievement gaps.
- IBHE made budget recommendations and gave GSU a very favorable recommendation that exceeded our requests. GSU requested 8% IBHE recommended highest increase of 12%.
