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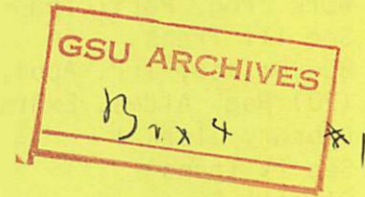

VETS: HOW'S YOUR STANDING...It has been announced by the Office of VP for Academic Affairs that according to University student records a large number of veterans are not in Academic Good Standing. Each college dean is preparing a letter advising these veterans/students that they will not be permitted to register for the Fall 1976 trimester or thereafter unless they are certified to be in Academic Good Standing.

SSAC ELECTIONS SCRAPPED...Due to voting irregularities "of enormous proportions" according to Acting SS Director Doug Davis, SSAC elections will be held again June 7, 8, and 9. A ballot booth will be located next to the information office on the first floor, open 10 am to 7 pm. The elections will be conducted by the civil service and professional staff of Student Services.

FY77 FACULTY SALARY INCREASES DEFERRED... The BOG has announced that in recognition of a collective bargaining referendum, it will defer distribution of FY77 salary increases until an election is held to select a bargaining agent, so that the agent would have "a fair opportunity to negotiate over salaries."

As previously announced, an election is scheduled for the fall, but if the faculty does not choose an agent at that time, the Board will be free to release deferred salary increases for immediate distribution on a retroactive basis to Sept. 1976. Salary hikes for other than academic employees will follow the normal time schedule for such increases: July 1 for non-negotiated civil service employees; Sept. 1 for all other Board employees who are outside the bargaining unit of academic employees.

ORDERS PLEASE...The last day of the fiscal year, June 30, is also the last day purchase orders may be issued against FY76 funds. To avoid any eleventh hour problems, please submit as many of your purchase requests as possible well before late June. All FY76 requisitions must be in the Purchasing Office by no later than 5 p.m., Friday, June 25. Requisitions for next year can be submitted at any time but no purchases will be made until after FY77 appropriations have been released.
