NAMING OF THE PRES...The campus presidential search committee met June 7 and selected, in accordance with the mandate given by the Board of Governors presidential search committee, five candidates of the seven submitted. They are in alphabetical order: Dr. William H. Capitan, acting president, West Virginia Wesleyan College, Buckhannon; Dr. Leo Goodman-Malamuth, vice-president for academic affairs, California State University, Long Beach; Dr. Donald Robinson, dean of the College of Education, Oklahoma State University, Stillwater; Dr. John H. Strange, dean of College of Public and Community Service, University of Massachusetts, Boston; Dr. Charles Vevier, executive vice-president, College of Medicine and Dentistry, Newark, N.J.

According to the procedures established by the BOG, the BOG committee will now select three to be interviewed by the entire Board of Governors who will choose a president. The name of the new president of GSU will be announced by the Board in Springfield, Thurs., June 17. A brief news conference will be held at the Chicago Press Club on that same day, where he will be introduced by Pres. Engbretson. A second news conference is scheduled for local media at 3:00 p.m. that day when he will be at GSU in the CCC. A reception is to be held at 4:00 p.m. to introduce the new pres. to faculty, staff and students. Pres. Engbretson will accompany his successor from Springfield by private plane to introduce him at the news conference.

QA ON CS...Q. May applicants for CS examinations be rejected or disqualified?

A. The employer may reject an applicant, or, after examination, the Director may refuse to certify any candidate who: fails to pass a physical examination given to determine physical qualifications for employment; uses intoxicating beverages to excess or uses narcotics; has been dismissed from either private or public service for a cause detrimental to his employment by an employer under the System; has maintained an unsatisfactory employment record; has practiced deception or fraud on his application, examination, or material pertaining to these; or has committed an offense which, in the judgment of the Director disqualifies him for employment.

COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AND AFSCME...The current contract between GSU and Local 2770 of the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) will terminate June 30, 1976. AFSCME and the GSU Administration have mutually agreed that bargaining on a new contract will not begin until Local 2770 has demonstrated a majority (50% + 1) representation of the status employees in the classes listed. These status employees are currently being solicited by Local 2770 to sign a collective bargaining authorization card authorizing Local 2770 to act as the sole bargaining agent in matters concerning wages, hours and working conditions. Employees have free choice to sign or not. Any attempts to coerce should be reported immediately to John Kirksey, Director of Personnel, and Linda Reeve, President of Local 2770.
