Her research and publications focus on mass incarceration and reentry, cancer health disparities among incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals, and violence against women.

Dr. Tingting He, Division of Marketing, Management, and Entrepreneurship, College of Business. (far right)

Dr. He teaches a wide array of courses in Marketing. Her research focuses on market competition and the various effects. Dr. He's research also examines behaviors of consumers in the market and in organizations. Dr. He frequently serves as editor and reviewer for journals, including the International Journal of E-Business Research.
