BPS TESTING...The Quantitative Foundations for Business Administration and Written Communications competency examinations have been mandatory since September, 1973, for all undergraduate students. As a result of recent Collegial Assembly action, they are now also mandatory for all graduate students admitted to the College for the Spring Trimester, 1976, and subsequent semesters. (This policy does not apply to graduate students admitted to the College prior to the Spring Trimester, 1976.) Failure to take this examination at the scheduled times will result in denial of permission to register for the winter.
