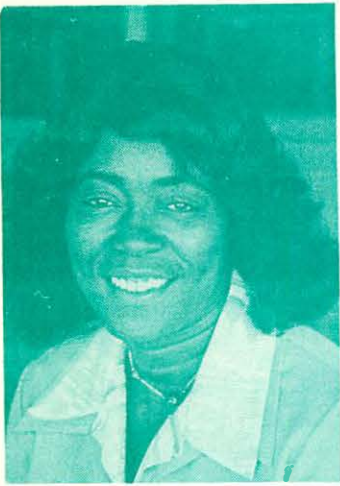

She was elected a Student Representative to the BOG by a landslide vote which came as no surprise to anyone who knows Maudstine "Tina" Macon. By voting for her as their student representative, the students have assured themselves of representation of the highest quality. A lovely lady with a warm smile, Tina is in daily contact with the students in her work/study position in Health Services. "I am familiar with the needs of students, not only because I work with them but because I, too, am a student." Her decision to run as student representative was further influenced by the fact that although students voice many complaints, they neither act on them nor make them to the right people. "I hope to make myself available to students as an avenue to the BOG, so students can know they truly do have a "voice" where it counts."

Tina enrolled at GSU in 1975 in HLD; after receiving an AA degree in Social Work from Thornton Community College.

Returning to school at the age of 39, Tina had a fairly clear view of her educational goals. "Three young adults in my family were constantly in trouble, in and out of jail; I felt that the rehabilitation system was not working, I wanted to find out why." She discovered she needed more education which led her to earning a BA in Human Services, with an emphasis in corrections. She is presently a graduate student in Alcoholism Science in EAS. "I have found that a large percentage of crimes are committed under the influence of alcohol; and yet our prisons are not equipped to deal with alcoholics. I hope to see programs developed that will make alcoholism counseling mandatory for prisoners."

Prior to her college career Tina was a Medical Corpsman with the Women's Army Corp for two years. She then attended Cregier Technical School in Chicago where she received her training as a licensed practical nurse. Employed by the Professional Nurses Bureau, she performed private duty nursing and staff relief in hospitals.

Recalling her days of volunteer work with the PACE Institute at Cook County Jail (tutoring inmates in reading & math for GED exams) Tina said, "A prison guard would lead the way through the tiers of cells announcing "Lady on the Boulevard--Lady on the Boulevard." She is presently doing volunteer work with the Harvey Community Youth Center as well as a student internship with the Illinois Status Offenders Services, where she works with juvenile run-aways and truants.

Tina is a member of the Black Feminist Movement and was recently elected to its Board of Directors.

She will soon be on her way to Springfield to attend her first official BOG meeting and students can be sure that there is indeed a "Lady on the Boulevard" fully prepared and highly qualified to speak on their behalf.
