GSU ACTS ON ENROLLMENT DIP...Concerns over decreasing enrollments prompted a meeting of all GSU faculty and professional staff Monday afternoon, June 6. The discussion was led by President Leo G-M., who began with a review of GSU enrollment figures and patterns since 1974 and projections for Fall '78. Identified as a contributing factor in the decline was enactment of the Academic Good Standing Policy which tightened requirements and resulted in an initial loss of 900 students. 1978 budget requests for the University were based on enrollment projections that will now constitute a 34% increase over present enrollment figures. The president then called for suggestions from faculty and staff for more effective student recruitment and retention methods to meet those projections. Discussion followed from the floor, with all suggestions noted for later reference. Planned is the formation of a committee to examine the problem and develop recommendations for action.

ACADEMIC PORTALS SWING WIDE...It has been announced that all academic programs at GSU are now open to students for the fall term. Several programs closed for over a year to additional student enrollment are now available. Deadline for submitting applications and credentials for fall admission is Aug. 10, 1977. Registration will be held Aug. 30-31.

A HEARTFELT THANK YOU...Soon after Leo Goodman-Malamuth arrived last fall, he gave me the task of chairing a committee which was to plan a commencement "in keeping with the spirit of the academy." The committee worked hard to plan such a graduation weekend. As chairperson I want to extend an heartfelt thank you to everyone in the University community who participated in planning and implementing last weekend's graduations. So many people extended themselves that, were I to name them here, there would be room for little else in this issue of Faze I! The committee experienced overwhelming cooperation. WIN SOME--LOSE SOME...Almost all employees will find a little more take-home pay in paychecks received after June 1st, because the amount deducted for federal income tax will decrease under the Tax Reduction and Simplification Act of 1977. For many employees, however, this decrease in taxes withheld will mean larger tax payments or smaller refunds when their returns are filed next year. Under the law tax reductions are confined to employees who take the standard deduction. Consequently employees who itemize deductions or single employees with an annual income in excess of \$25,000 may want to reduce their number of exemptions to offset the decreased amount of federal income tax withheld. FROM THE AFFIRMATIVE ACTION OFFICE...The University's Affirmative Action Advisory Committee has completed a first draft of the Affirmative Action Plan for Handicapped. The draft will be circulated within the week to Unit Heads and to all identifiable handicapped members of the University Community for their review and input. A subcommittee of the Affirmative Action Advisory Committee is presently reviewing the requirements of Title IX for an Institutional Self-Evaluation. The purpose of this evaluation is to assess all areas of student treatment in order to identify any areas of sex discrimination and if so identified, to make recommendations for change. The projected completion date for this project is February 28, 1978. Members of the University staff will be receiving requests in the near future for information to be used in completing this self-evaluation.
