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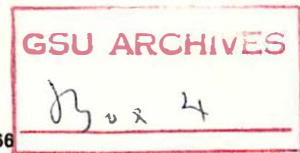

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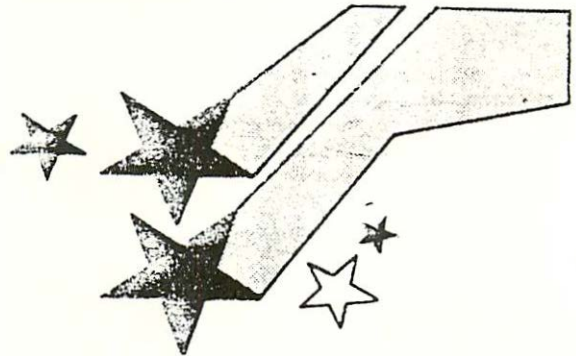

EXCEL TRAINING COURSE BEGINS...An eight week training course for GSU office employees will begin July 20, 1977. Specific skills will be taught in: Understanding Information Needs, Working with Different Managerial Styles, Thinking Through Ideas, Selecting Work Methods, Planning Communication, Analyzing Communication Failures, Using the Telephone, Giving Reports, Coping with Changes, Getting Work Done Through Others, Capitalizing on Mistakes, Anticipating Problems, Breaking Down Responsibilities, Planning Time, Setting Standards and Setting Self-Development Goals. The course will be repeated regularly to accommodate all interested employees. Enrollment forms are available in the Personnel Office.

FURTHER WORD ON FY78 SALARY FOR NON-NEGOTIATED STAFF...Salary adjustments for fiscal year 1978 have been calculated in accordance with Board of Governors guidelines which stipulate that the first 4% of salary increase dollars shall be distributed on a 50/50 plan. This means that one-half of such dollars shall be provided in equal amounts to eligible non-negotiated employees and the other half becomes a percentage applied to each employees' base salary. On July 1, each employee will receive a brief description of the procedure followed in determining her/his salary. Increases for non-negotiated staff are effective July 1 and will appear on the July 15 payroll. Civil service employees who are in an initial probationary period on June 30, 1977 will be eligible to receive a salary increase effective upon successful completion of probation as outlined in the Civil Service Compensation policy.

CHANGING OF THE CARD...Block 3 Parking Card (#32-Green) is now available for purchase at the Cashier's Office and the Bookstore. The Block 3 card will cost \$7.00 and becomes valid July 5, 1977. The trimester parking card (#31-Black) and Block 3 (#32-Green) parking card will be valid until September 5, 1977. Please note that the parking gates are activated by the number code, not the color. Check your card!

University Professor of Nursing; Ph.D. level degree or equivalent required. Application deadline is August 1, 1977.

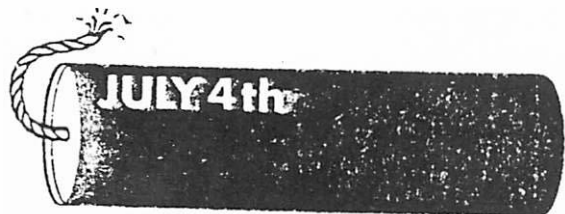

VIA CETA AND GSU...Because of a new contract involving Comprehensive Employment Training (CETA) and GSU, thirty-five positions are available at the University for residents of Will and Grundy counties. The offered positions are directed toward unemployed who qualify under Title VI eligibility criteria and possess particular skills. The eligibility criteria: applicant must be a member of a family with current income at or below 70 per centum of the lower living standard income level; whose family is receiving aid to families with dependent children under Title IV of the social security act, or who has been receiving unemployment compensation for 15 or more weeks, or who is ineligible for unemployment compensation and unemployed for 15 or more weeks (does not apply to Viet Nam Vets) or who is unemployed and has exhausted all unemployment compensation benefits.
