INAUGURATION...plans are near completion as the Oct. 7 date approaches. Dr. Curtis McCray, University Provost, will preside. The Executive Director of the National Association of State Colleges and Universities Allan W. Ostar will deliver the principal address. The day's program will open with an academic convocation, at which selected faculty members will discuss Daniel Bell's "The Revolution of Rising Entitlements." The convocation will take place at 9:30 a.m. in the science lecture hall of the College of Environmental and Applied Sciences. A buffet luncheon will follow. The academic procession and inauguration of Dr. Leo Goodman-Malamuth II will take place at 2 p.m. in the University gymnasium, with a reception set for 3:30 p.m. An inaugural performance of Moliere's "The Doctor in Spite of Himself" will be presented by the College of Cultural Studies at 5 p.m. in the University theatre. Attendance will be by invitation.

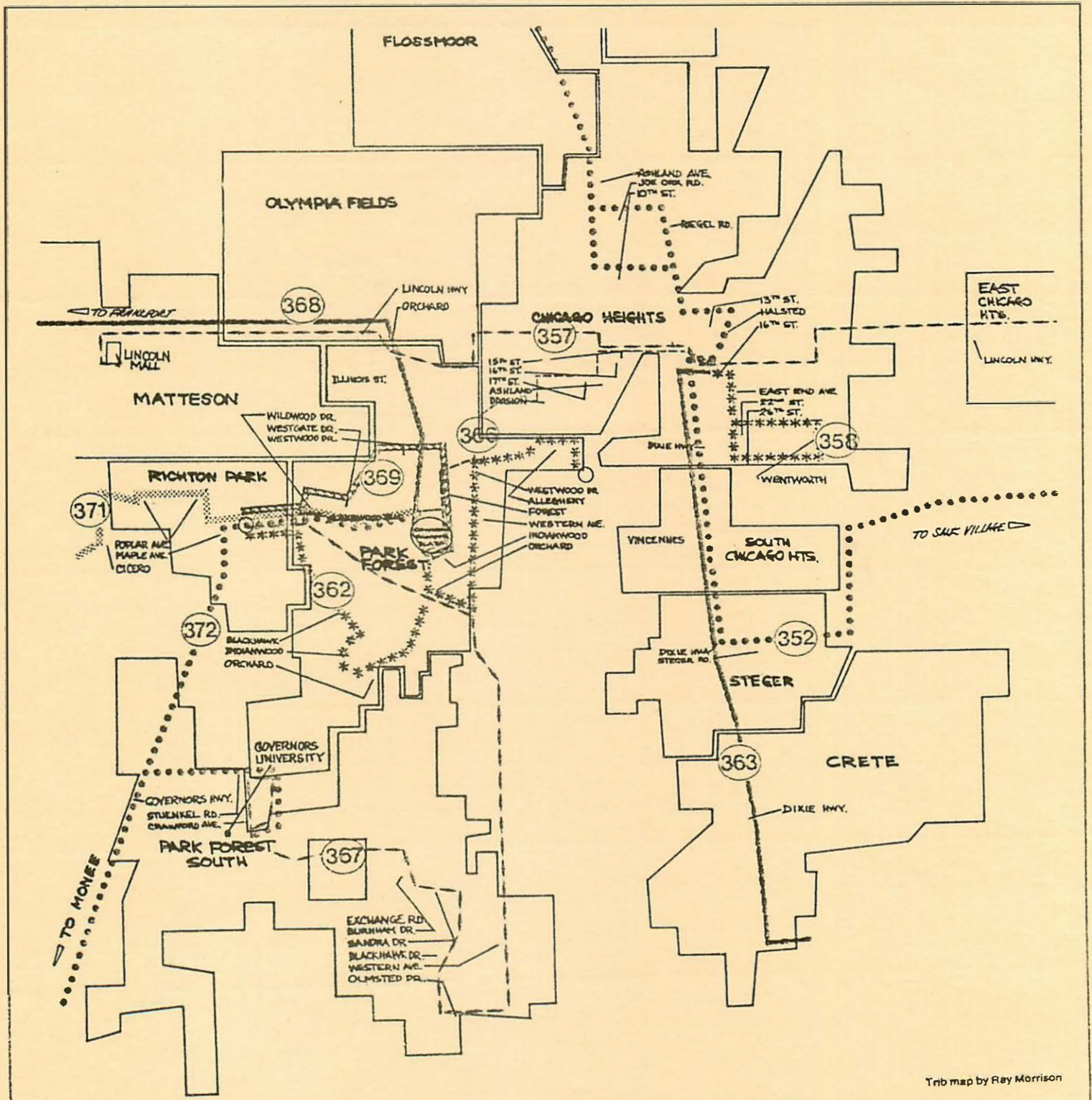
POLLUTION SLEUTHS PLAN TAKE OFF...A GSU research team will be joined by the National Center for Atmospheric Research in an experimental study of atmospheric pollution of Lake Michigan. Dr. Herman Sievering, University Professor of Engineering Science directs the University research with a team of atmospheric science students in the Environmental Analyst Program. A scientifically equipped twin-engine seaplane from the National Center for Atmospheric Research will be located at Midway Airport Sept. 25 through Sept. 30. Dr. Sievering will be available to describe the plane and its use in Lake Michigan pollution research on Sept. 27-29 at 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Primary support for the study comes from Region V Environmental Protection Agency and its research ship, R. V. Simons. The \$250,000 three-year study covers the atmospheric route for pollutant loading by lead, cadmium, and other metal pollutants as well as the lake nutrients phosphate and nitrate.
