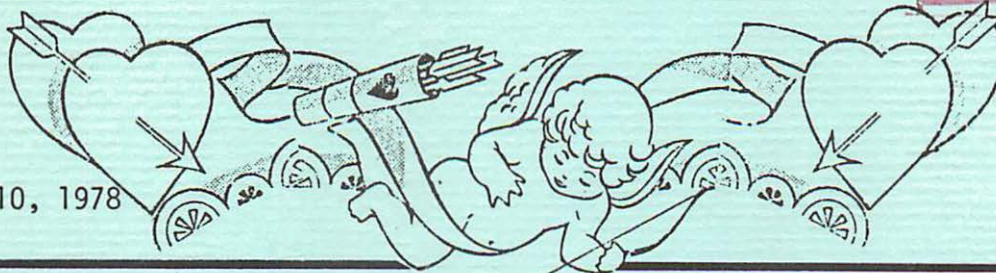

A FOND FAREWELL . . .

Albert Martin, assistant to the provost at GSU has announced his retirement effective March 1, 1978.

An educator for nearly 30 years in the south suburban area, he began teaching social studies at Bloom Township high school in 1948. In 1953 he became the founding dean and first president of Bloom Community College which later became Prairie State College. He held this position until 1966 when he resigned to accept a position with the Illinois Community College Board.

Martin joined GSU in 1970 as the coordinator of community college relations. He served in this capacity until July 1, 1977. He also held the position of assistant vice president for academic affairs from May 1971 to July 1, 1977.

WHEN TO X-RAY ? . . .

Decision making by physicians will be discussed at the February 15 Faculty Research Seminar by Dr. Harry V. Roberts of the Graduate School of Business at the University of Chicago. The meeting is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. in room E1104.

Dr. Roberts will speak on how ideas from statistical decision theory help to decide when diagnostic tests are needed.

For the last 19 of his 29 years with the University of Chicago, Dr. Roberts has been professor of statistics. He was formerly manager of marketing research for McCann-Erickson, Inc. Chicago office.

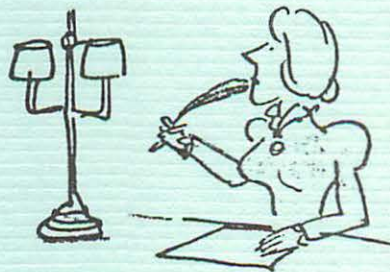

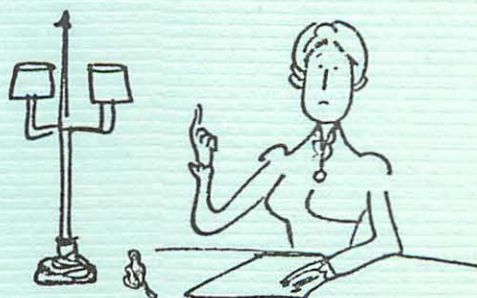
