M.I.P.: INCENTIVE AWARDS PROGRAM...names a BOG system-wide program to encourage submission of management improvement suggestions through incentive awards. Most valuable ideas contributing to operational economy, efficiency or management effectiveness, and most valuable performance on the job "in addition to special acts/services rendered" will be recognized by cash awards, certificates of recognition, and special achievement awards. Contributions will be evaluated by the Incentive Awards Committee on the basis of 1) general applicability to campus operations, 2) portability to other campuses, 3) cost savings, 4) productivity increase, 5) efficiency increase, 6) creativeness, 7) impact on operational effectiveness (mission and programs). Rated on a scale of 1-10, contributions receiving a "10" will receive a maximum award of \$1,000, with lesser amounts for lower ratings.

All BOG system employees are eligible to submit their suggestions by June 15, 1978. For details on submission format, contact Betty Elliot in Personnel.
