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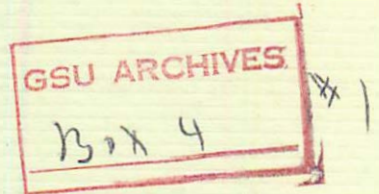

#### MINI - GRANTS AVAILABLE ..

GSU faculty, staff, and students (when sponsored by a faculty member), are eligible to submit applications to GSU's 1978-79 Mini-Grant Program. The Program provides support to conduct basic and applied research, and scholarly projects. Projects which are relevant to and enable the University to better achieve its goals and fulfill its mission, as well as projects which have the potential of being submitted to external sponsors for further support are given highest priority.

Mini-Grant awards will range from a few hundred to around a thousand dollars. Projects may start in early November and must be completed by June of 1979. The absolute deadline for applications is 5:00 p.m. on October 2, 1978.

#### BENEFITS FOR SENIOR SCHOLARS ...

Tuition and fees will be waived for senior citizens enrolling for up to six units of credit per Trimester at GSU. Regular tuition and fees will be required for registration beyond six units per Trimester.

A senior scholar is a person who:

- is 65 years of age or older, or is 60-64 years of age and is not working full time, or is retired; and

- applies for such a designation; and

- meets established admission requirements for students at large.

Units of credit earned by senior scholars will apply to an academic degree only after application and admission to a degree program and only if the previous units of credit are appropriate to that specific program.

Senior scholars will follow established procedures for auditing courses, but all fees will be waived.

## A NEW GSU PARKING SYSTEM ....

In recognition of the limited parking facilities which are available during peak periods and the awkwardness of the mechanical gate controls which regulate the parking lots, a major renovation of the GSU parking system is currently being undertaken. Based on an extensive study by the consulting firm of Ralph Burke and Associates followed by much consideration by the Physical Resources Committee and the GSU administration, a new parking system has been designed.

Approximately 230 new parking spaces will be provided by extensions to lots B and C and the visitor's lot. Spaces restricted for use by handicapped persons will be designated at the north ends of lots B and C. Severely handicapped persons will be given special permission to park in designated areas adjacent to the building. Curb ramps for the handicapped are also being built.

To facilitate the flow of traffic, the campus drive will be extended around the south side of Lot B and parallel Lot A on the west side until it intersects with the inner drive. This new drive will give easier access to lots B and A while allowing perimeter traffic flow.

Due to the difficulties which have been experienced with the parking lot gates, these gates will be removed; consequently, a new parking control system will be required. It is intended that the subsequent system will also facilitate the use of the lots by visitors, students and staff.

An information center is being constructed on the west drive leading onto the campus from Stuenkel Road. The function of this center, which will be open from 7:30 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday and 8:00 a.m. until Noon on Saturday, will be to provide parking information and daily permits to park. The present "parking card" system will be converted to a "bumper sticker" system on September 5. The operation of this system will be similar to the card system; i.e., the stickers will be available on either a trimester or annual basis with the cost remaining at \$8.00 per trimester or \$22.00 for an annual sticker. Each person who purchases a regular sticker may purchase an additional one for a dollar. Replacement stickers will also cost \$1.00. If a sticker is not purchased, daily parking will remain at 50¢ to be paid at the information center where a daily parking permit will be issued. This daily charge will be applicable to students, staff, faculty and visitors.

The bumper stickers, which will be a split-pair to be affixed on front and rear bumpers or placed inside of a plastic envelope to be suspended from the rear view mirror, will also be available for car pools. Where two or more students, faculty, or staff ride together a single car pool sticker may be purchased on the same basis as the individualized sticker. It will be transferrable from one car to another within the same pool of riders and drivers.

The former "Visitor's Lot" will be expanded and designated "Guest Lot". Only vehicles with "G" parking permits will be permitted to park therein. There will be a limited program of complimentary guest parking.

Applications for stickers will be available at the Cashier's Office and the Bookstore beginning the week of August 28. Further information will be available in a new brochure.
