H S A A C C R E D I T E D ...

The EAS School of Health Sciences has been formally notified that its graduate program in Health Services Administration has been accredited by the Association of University Programs in Health Administration (AUPHA).

Graduate programs in health services administration are reviewed by the Accrediting Commission on Education for Health Services Administration (ACEHSA), the agency organized specifically for this field, of which AUPHA is a corporate member.

Dr. Sang-O Rhee, HSA Program Coordinator, and Dr. Robert Cornesky, Director of the School of Health Sciences, have jointly guided GSU into an enviable position: as of March 15, 1978, only 38 graduate programs were accredited nationwide and GSU now joins this distinguished group.

Much of the success of the program in Health Services Administration can be attributed to the splendid efforts of the HSA faculty; Shoshana Falk, Clyde Gardner, and Brian Malec.

The Association of University Programs in Health Administration is an international consortium of 120 universities in 19 nations.

C E T A U P D A T E

GSU has received word from the Will-Grundy CETA Consortium that almost two of our proposals for the new year starting October 1, 1978, have been approved. A community services news-letter and several existing positions will be funded for a total of \$219,653. 22 people will be employed under these proposals. Two other proposals, one for a maintenance project and one in the LRC, were not funded.

Cook County Board of Commissioners will be officially meeting on October 2 to vote on a LAC network proposal to be staffed by 22 more people at a funding level of more than \$243,000.
