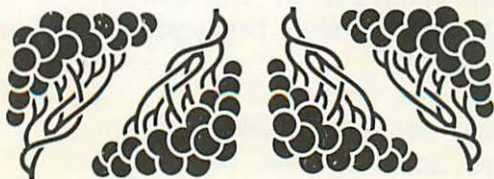
TAKE YOUR CHOICE . . .

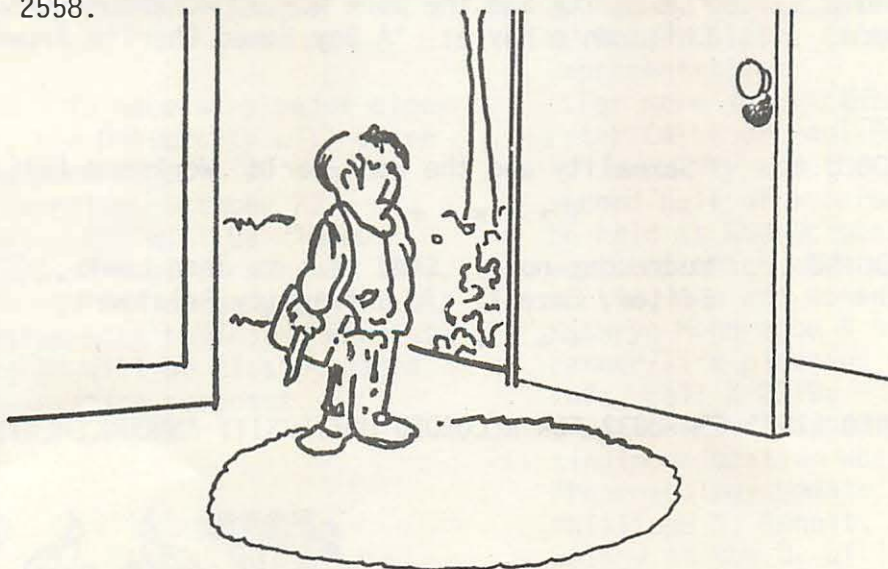

NOTICE OF ACTING POSITION

Provost McCray, as President Goodman-Malamuth's designee, announces his intention to fill the position of Associate Vice President for Organized Research on an acting basis. Any person interested in holding this position on an acting basis and as described below should submit a one-page letter of application stating qualifications to Provost Curtis McCray before 5:00 p.m., Monday, October 9, 1978.

Provost McCray will receive the advice of a committee of five persons (appointed by him) who will screen the applications. The Provost will make the selection and will be guided by the committee's recommendations.

Those applying should have had to some degree the following experiences:

1. Written a successful grant application.
2. As a principal investigator, administered a grant.
3. Had experience in some administrative capacity (program coordinator, assistant dean, etc.).
4. Had experience in managing a university budget.

Conditions:

1. As per University policy, the position carries a 10 percent increment to the current salary base.
2. The position terminates June 30, 1979, or when a permanent Associate Vice President for Organized Research joins GSU, whichever comes first.
3. Applicants must be willing to travel and to work long hours.
