WOMEN STUDENTS BEWARE... Men and women enter college with similarly high aspirations, but during the undergraduate years, women tend to lose much of their ambition and to have lower self-esteem. The data in a study entitled "Men and Women Learning Together: Coeducation in the 1980's" indicate that women encounter subtle problems that impede their higher education and narrow their career options. The report identified several problems confronting female students: 1) women may be unaware of the strains that beset a two-career family because while women's attitudes have changed, men continue to have more traditional attitudes toward women, careers and motherhood, 2) women students are often cut off from developing quantitative and mechanical skills, so many scientific and other fields are closed to women because they lack necessary skills, 3) female students have relatively little contact with women faculty members or administrators who could set examples and offer more career-directed attention. On a more positive note, the data indicate that women believe themselves to be almost equal competition with men in the classroom.

Ortiz will report to the Dean of Special Programs and Instructional Services. He received his B.A. degree from Atlantic Union College and M.D.V. and S.T.M. from McCormick Seminary.

Flying from London to Montreal, London's "Baccholian Singers" will divert for an appearance at GSU, Sunday, January 21, at 8 p.m. The classical music series of Student Affairs and Services is in the Music Recital Hall. Admission for GSU students will be \$1; senior citizens, alumni association members, GSU staff, and students \$2, and general public \$3.
