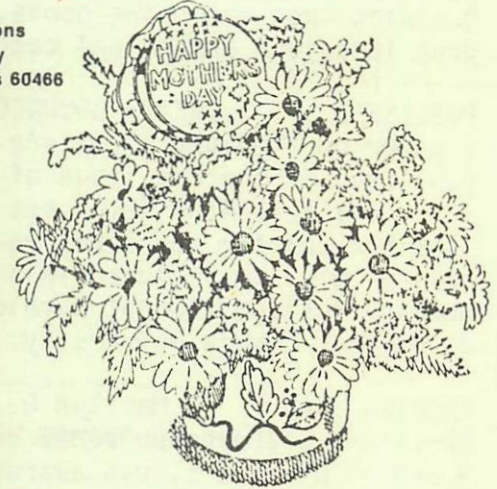

FACULTY NOMINATIONS ACCEPTED . . . GSU's full-time faculty members are requested to submit nominations for GSU representative and two alternates to the Board of Governors Council of Faculties. Pamela Rebeck, HLD University Professor, is the outgoing representative. Constance Ripstra-Kennedy, HLD University Professor, is vacating one alternate position. The Council is the faculty advisory group to the Board of Governors. All full-time faculty members are eligible for election to these positions. Nominations are made by petition which must be signed by eight full-time faculty members. Completed petitions must be returned to the Office of the University Assembly before 5 p.m., May 25, 1979. The petition is on page 3 of this week's Faze I. Faculty members will be notified of the balloting date and process. Election results will be posted after balloting.

SPRING/SUMMER MEALS . . . from the cafeteria will come in the form of hot sandwiches, grilled foods, salads and desserts. The steam table will be closed during the S/S Trimester and the fast food operation will be in effect. Daily specials will be offered. Hank Huitt of the Business Office cites decreased S/S enrollment as the reason for the change in food offerings. The cafeteria will return to full meal service Fall Trimester. Cafeteria hours are: Monday-Thursday, 11 a.m. - 7:30 p.m.; Friday, 11 a.m. - 2 p.m.

IR&P HEADS COMPUTER ACTIVITIES . . . Effective immediately, the responsibility for the coordination of GSU computer activities are assigned to the Office of Institutional Research and Planning.

Vice President Virginio Piucci and Associate Vice President Gerald Baysore of IR&P will work with the appropriate computer committees and Ron Miller, Site Manager for the Cooperative Computer Center, to see that computer services are delivered and a data management system is developed.

Service requests and problem reports should continue to be submitted to Mr. Miller. They will then be forwarded to Dr. Baysore for authorization. Significant time delays will not occur with this process.

MEMORIAL DAY OBSERVANCE

In accordance with Federal law, Memorial Day will be observed by GSU on the last Monday in May. The University will be closed on Monday, May 28, to allow faculty, staff and students an opportunity to observe Memorial Day. Since the Academic Calendar lists Wednesday, May 30, as the holiday, some rescheduling of programs and classes will be necessary. Faculty members should make a special effort to notify students that the University will be open Wednesday, May 30, but closed Monday, May 28.

FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE . . . The Library has had a book drop installed at the front entrance of GSU so it won't be necessary to park and make a special trip inside the building when returning books. The new book drop is bright orange and can't be missed.

PUBLISHED . . . ARTHUR BOURGEOIS (CCS) has a paper on "Mbwoolo Sculpture of the Yaka" published in the May issue of African Arts . . . JOYCE KENNEDY (HLD) has been notified that her chapter on "Creative Career Counseling" will be included in a forthcoming book on college student development by J. Eddy of Loyola University.

GLOWING GRAD . . . Marilyn D. Zwiers, Vice President of Correspondence on the GSU Alumni Board of Directors, was awarded the Women's Education Division Creative Programming Award 1979 by the National University Extension Association. She is the women's program coordinator of the Institute for Continuing Education at Purdue University Calumet campus and initiated and directed the "Entry into Technology" training program for unemployed women.
