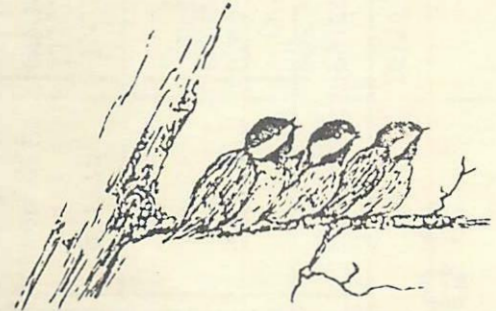

THE BILLY TAYLOR TRIO . . . will appear in concert Friday, July 13, at 8:30 p.m. in the Music Recital Hall. The jazz concert is one of the CCS-sponsored events in celebration of GSU's Tenth Anniversary. Billy Taylor, often referred to as the elder statesman of jazz, is a pianist, composer, recording artist, arranger, conductor, actor, author and lecturer. Tickets will be available at the door for \$2 general admission. GSU staff and students will be admitted free.

ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION . . . GSU's Tenth Anniversary festivities will culminate Sunday, July 15, with the 2 p.m. Academic Convocation and Reception. Garry Mills, writer, scholar and syndicated columnist, will be the keynote speaker. More than 50 academic institutions

will be represented at the Convocation in the Gym. More than 50 GSU faculty will also participate. Presenting papers will be Dr. Daniel Bernd of CCS, representing the GSU faculty; and Mildred Johnson, representing GSU alumni. Platform guests will include Dr. William E. Engbretson, GSU's founding president, and past and present members of the Board of Governors and Board of Higher Education who played important roles in the planning and founding of the University. The Anniversary Reception will follow on the Governors Patio. Tickets for Sunday's event can be obtained from the Office of Student Affairs and Services.
