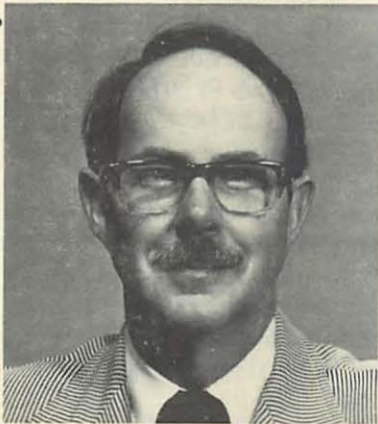

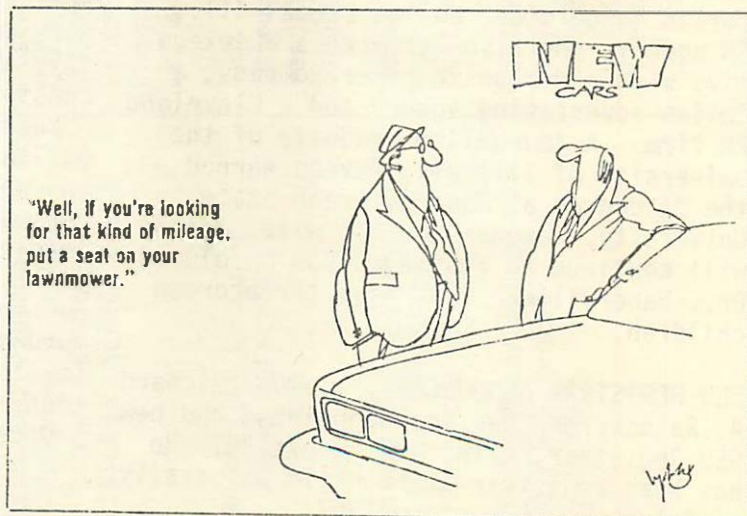
THE SPEAKERS BUREAU . . . of GSU is addressing community groups. Telephone x2436 for the speakers bureau in the Office of Community Services.
