ASSOCIATE VICE PRESIDENT FOR RESEARCH APPOINTED . . . Dr. Sheadrick A. Tillman IV has been appointed Associate Vice President for Research at GSU. President Goodman-Malamuth made the announcement Thursday. Dr. Tillman has been coordinator of technical assistance for research at the graduate school of Northern Illinois University since 1976. Previously at Chicago State University, he was an instructor, coordinator of occupational education programs and, later, assistant director of research services. He also has been on the visiting or adjunct faculties of Alabama A&M University, St. Cloud (Minn.) State College, University of Illinois (Circle Campus), Central State University (Ohio) and Ohio State University. A graduate of Southern Illinois University with the B.S. and M.S. Ed. degrees, Dr. Tillman earned the Ed.D. degree at Northern Illinois University. He will begin his duties on September 14 at GSU and will be responsible for promoting and administering research and grants activities of the faculty and staff.

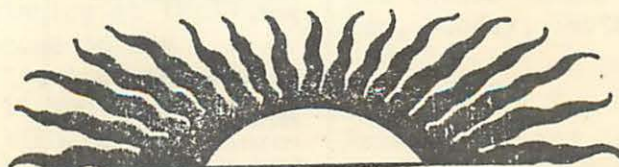
