#### SALM DUO TO PERFORM . . .

Noted pianist Erna Salm and her daughter, acclaimed cellist Susan Salm, will open the Chamber Music series at GSU Friday, October 19, at 8 p.m. in the Music Recital Hall. Also appearing on the program will be soprano Dimpna Clarin and clarinetist Donald Kramer. Tickets are \$2 for general admission, \$1 for GSU faculty and staff, Alumni Association members and senior citizens. Tickets are on sale at the Cashier's Office. Tickets are free to GSU students and may be obtained from the Student Activities Office.

#### OPEN LECTURE . . .

Stella Pevsner, award-winning children's author from Palatine, Ill., will speak in Engbretson Hall at 7 p.m. Monday, Oct. 15. The public is invited to hear her talk and participate in a question and answer session.

#### CAPACITY CROWD EXPECTED . . .

Advance ticket sales indicate that a capacity crowd of about 1,500 persons will attend the lecture by Jane Fonda and Tom Hayden at GSU, Wednesday, Oct. 17, at 8 p.m. The controversial husband and wife team will discuss "Critical Issues Facing Us in the 1980s." There will be no ticket sales at the door. Requests for the remaining tickets will be accepted by mail until 5 p.m. Friday, October 12. Remaining tickets may be purchased in person at GSU's Cashier's Office from 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m., Monday and Tuesday, October 15-16, and from the Office of Student Activities from 5-8 p.m. Tickets are free for GSU students.

#### GSU ON THE AIR . . .

The Jane Fonda and Tom Hayden lecture will be videotaped by the Instructional Communications Center staff as the first of a series of GSU special event programs to be aired by Kankakee television cable. The Fonda/Hayden lecture, produced and edited in the ICC, will be aired as a 90-minute special by Kankakee, October 23. Some of the videotape footage will be shown on the Kankakee cable news following the October 17 appearance. Heading the production team will be Producer Ralph Kruse, Director Lamarr Scott and Audio Engineer John Mulder. Both the Fonda/Hayden address and the preceding press conference will be videotaped.
