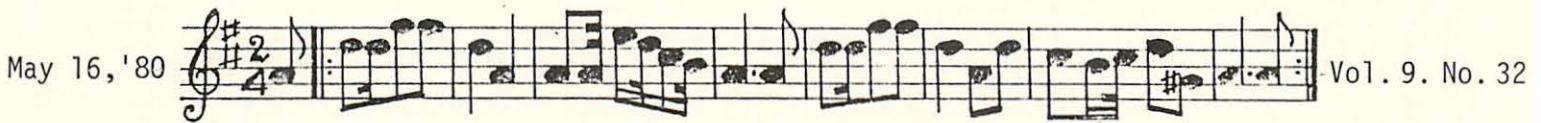

GUEST ARTISTS . . . Joseph Guastafeste, principal bass viol for the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, and Dmitry Paperno, international concert pianist, will appear as guest artists with the Governors State University String Quartet at the first annual President's Concert, Wednesday, May 12, at 7:30 p.m. in GSU's Music Recital Hall. The GSU String Quartet was organized late in 1979 by violinist Francois D'Albert, GSU Community Professor of Music since 1978. The other members of the Quartet are: violinist Elmer Rosen, concertmaster of the Fine Arts Symphony Orchestra and co-concertmaster of the Sherwood Symphony; violist Rami Solomonow, principal violist of the Lyric Opera Orchestra; and cellist Alan Rostoker, who has been principal cellist of several area orchestras. QUALIFICATIONS

The Director of Personnel must have a bachelor's degree from an accredited university. The successful candidate will have had at least two years of full-time employment service at Governors State University and will have an extensive understanding of Governors State University, the organizational units in all wings, and the operating policies and procedures of GSU. It is required that the successful candidate have had at least three years experience in the administration of higher education and that no less than two of these years will have been at GSU. These three years of experience shall have been at the level of administrative aide or higher. Preference will be given to those persons whose administrative experience has been in units that encompass broad areas of the University administration. As a result of the candidate's previous experience, there shall be a demonstrated understanding and appreciation for personnel management, budgeting, and civil service administration. It is imperative that the candidate have the ability to work effectively with employees in a higher education setting. Furthermore, the successful candidate will have demonstrated fluent written and oral communication skills.
