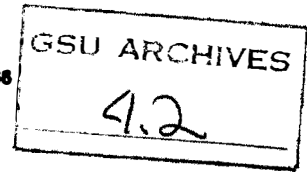

GSU ENROLLMENT STATISTICS AND TRENDS . . .
According to a report generated by GSU's Office of Institutional Research and Planning, GSU has experienced a 7.3% increase in total headcount enrollment between the Winter terms of 1978 and 1980. Off-campus headcount enrollment increased by 305% while the proportion of full-time students declined by 22% over the same period of time. An increase in daytime student enrollment has been realized since Fall Trimester 1979--from 21.4% to 24.4% of the total on-campus headcount in Winter Trimester 1980. Female students comprise an ever-increasing percentage of GSU's total student population. GSU's percentage of women has increased from 53% in Winter 1978 to 58% in Winter 1980, due primarily to the growth in Special Programs. During Winter 1980, a total of 4,012 students were enrolled --1,507 undergraduates and 2,505 graduates. Students were enrolled for a total of 25,544 credit hours. The enrollment data were compiled under the direction of Alan Bennett, Coordinator for Institutional Research. Additional information on enrollment dynamics can be obtained from the same office.

MOZART FESTIVAL . . . BUILDING ANALYSIS PLANNED . . . Governors State University has been awarded two federal assistant grants totaling \$10,216 to be used for a detailed analysis of modifications to make the main campus building and the GSU Annex more energy efficient. The federal funds will be combined with University funds amounting to \$12,000 for the study.
