THE GSU STRING QUARTET . . . will open its second season of performances at GSU on Sunday, October 26, at 4 p.m. The four distinguished musicians will perform works of Mozart, Schumann and Barber in a free concert in GSU's Music Recital Hall. Members of the Quartet (pictured above, left to right) are: Francois D'Albert, first violin; Elmer Rosen, second violin; Robert Shamo, viola; and Alan Rostoker, cello. The Quartet will be assisted by guest artists Erna Salm, piano, and Rudolf Strukoff, bass. The String Quartet was organized in 1979 by D'Albert, GSU Community Professor of Music. The public is invited to attend the upcoming concert.

THE SALM DUO . . . will present a concert of piano and cello music at 8 p.m., Friday, October 17, in GSU's Music Recital Hall. Erna Salm and her daughter Susan will perform music spanning four centuries. For ticket information, call x2464.

THERE WILL BE MUSIC AND COMEDY . . . in GSU's Music Recital Hall beginning at 8 p.m., Friday, October 24, when folksinger Jim Post and comic-mime O. J. Anderson provide the entertainment. A blend of sensitive ballads, rousing sing-alongs and political satires make up Post's musical repertoire. Anderson combines everyday comedies with drama to create his mime routines. Admission prices are: \$2 for the general public; \$1 for GSU faculty, staff and Alumni Association members, and senior citizens; and free for GSU students.

A CAST OF 12 ACTORS . . . has been chosen for the Governors State University production of Richard B. Sheridan's "The Rivals," to be presented in the GSU Theatre, November 14-15 and 21-22. The drama will be directed by Mel Slott University Professor of Theatre. It is set in the latter 18th Century. The cast includes Donald Elroy and Ginny Sugget-Elroy, Calumet City; Robert Alexander and Michael Renzi, Crete; Arthur Fox, Gary; Rebecca Borter, Homewood; Marilyn Shanok, Lansing; Wayne Reddick and Bruce Greenwood, Park Forest; and Robert Havens, St. Anne. Tymme Summers, Park Forest, and Susan Poole, Homewood, are assisting Slott in direction of the drama.
