GSU TO SPONSOR 7th ANNUAL THIRD WORLD CONFERENCE . . . Global interdependence and national development will be the theme of the 7th Annual Third World Conference on March 25-28 at the Palmer House in Chicago. Scholars from 83 universities and colleges from throughout the U.S. and nine foreign nations will delve into economics, politics, social change, education, health, peace, art and a myriad of other subjects pertinent to third world development. Thirty-nine panel discussions are scheduled to begin at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 26; 9:45 on Friday; and 9:30 on Saturday. The Honorable Mabel Murphy Smythe, deputy assistant secretary of state for African affairs will address a plenary session at noon on Thursday, and Mrs. Beverley Manley, former first lady of Jamaica, will speak at the Conference banquet on Friday. Admission to both of these sessions is by separate ticket. This event is being sponsored by the Division of Intercultural Studies and International Studies Core Project at GSU. Academic credit is available. Registration in advance or at the conference on Wednesday afternoon, March 25, is open to the public. The cost is \$25 per person (\$15 for students with ID) and covers credentials, refreshments and materials. For further info, contact Dr. Roger Oden at x2429 or Don Hansen, x2125.
