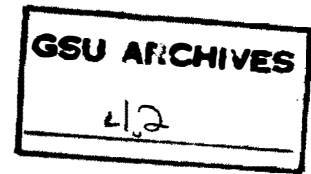

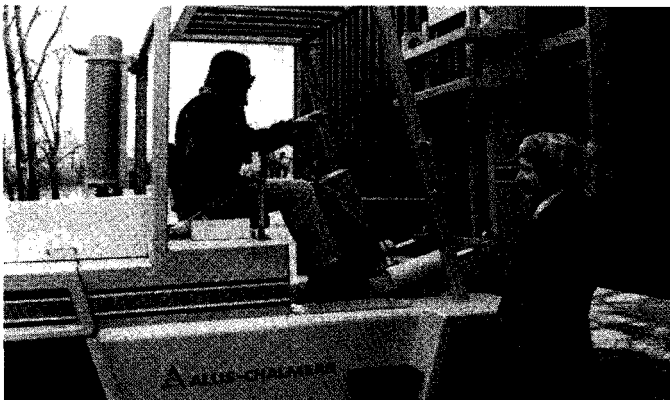

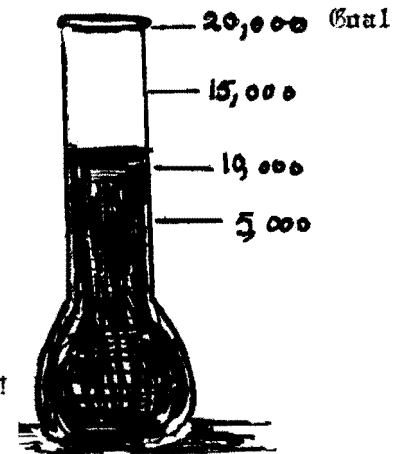


MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TRAINING . . . 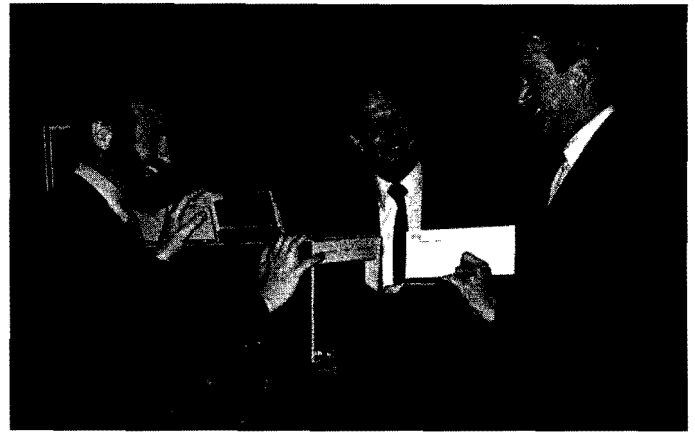
OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION RESEARCH REQUESTED...

CABLE TV WORKSHOP AT GSU . . . A cable TV workshop designed to introduce area residents to the use of local cable channels will be presented at GSU on April 25. The workshop is being made possible through a gift from Centel Communications to the GSU Foundation. "WIRED TO GO: How to Use Those Local Cable Channels" is intended for members of communities, institutions and organizations interested in utilizing local origination and access channels, soon to be available through franchise agreements between cable companies and municipalities. The workshop will introduce potential cable users to studio facilities and equipment utilized in local programming, and demonstrate the varied uses and differences between local origination, local access and educational access channels. The program will be coordinated by Melvyn Muchnik.
