As part of its call to action, the AACC is asking member institutions to promote the development and implementation of policies, practices, and institutional cultures that will produce 50 percent more students with high quality degrees and certifications by 2020.</p>

Maimon noted that the U.S. was once the world's leader in the number of young adults with college degrees, but now ranks tenth. She added that only 10 percent of students entering community colleges achieve a bachelor's degree within six years.</p>
